
Room Air Purifiers For Allergies

Dealing with Dust Mites

According to the American Academy of Allergy, Asthma and Immunology, or AAAAI, dust mites are the most common trigger for allergy sufferers. They are microscopic organisms that thrive by feeding on human skin cells. Allergic reactions are often triggered by the feces that they produce.

Dust mites live well in environments with humidity levels over forty percent and average temperatures higher than seventy degrees Fahrenheit. They are most commonly found in pillows, bedding, mattresses and soft furnishings where they have easy access to their food source of dead skin cells. However, dust mites can live just about anywhere in your home. Dust mites do not actually bite people. However, they do wreak havoc on the respiratory system.

In order to keep dust mites at bay, allergists recommend air purifiers as well as the following precautions:

- Washing linens in water hotter than 130°F on a weekly basis
- Using allergen-proof bedding
- Using a vacuum cleaner with HEPA technology
- Freezing your children's stuffed animals for three to five hours each week
- Choosing only children's toys that are washable

Putting Up With Pets

Allergic reactions to pets vary from one person to the next. Some breeds of cats and dogs are less likely to trigger allergy symptoms than others are. Therefore, prior to bringing a pet into your home, you should spend least thirty minutes with it to determine if you or any member of your family is allergic.

However, allergists recommend air purifiers with HEPA filters to remove the airborne particles in your home.
